Research Says:

Children with a parent in prison are more likely than their peers to end up incarcerated.

2.5 million children have one or both parents in prison. More than 100,000 of those children live in Georgia.

Children of the incarcerated are at high risk of emotional, behavioral, and developmental challenges. Many struggle academically.

You Said: All children can succeed.

Here's how you helped Foreverfamily children succeed in 2012-2013.

Served **128** children and teens through after school, mentoring, family visitation, and summer camp programming.

Made **520** face-to-face connections of children with their incarcerated mothers through monthly visits to Georgia's prisons.

Promoted **97%** of participants to the next grade and helped students earn an average GPA of **3.28**.

You helped students attend Clayton State University, Georgia Perimeter College, Fort Valley State University, and Lane College, graduate from Savannah State University, and start their lives as economically self-sufficient adults making positive contributions to our shared community.
